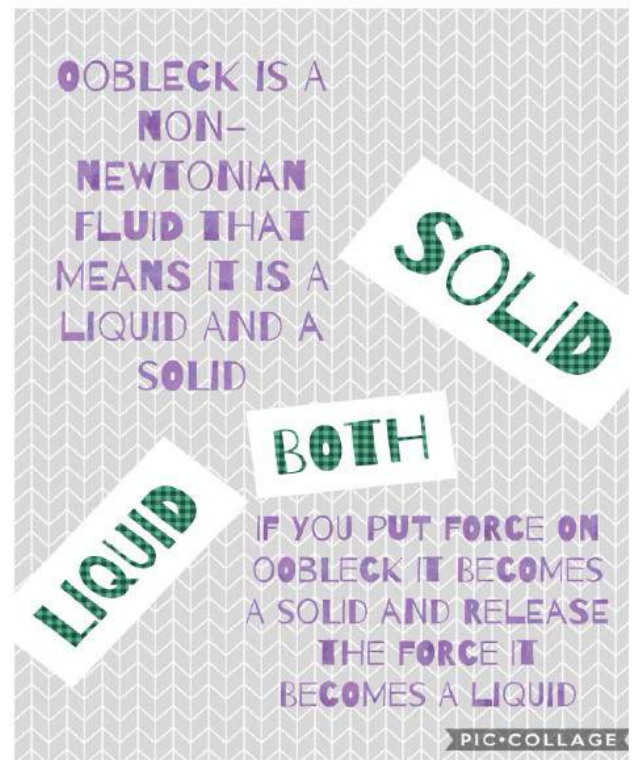
Hands-on science experiments and chemical reactions are always heaps of fun - especially when Oobleck is involved. Last week in Grade 5 we explored the changing states of matter and non-newtonian fluids. Here are some of our scientific explanations we posted on Showbie.

## Non Newtonian fluids

What is a non Newtonian fluid?

A non Newtonian fluid can take the form of a liquid or a solid depending on how much pressure you put on it. you could hold oobleck in your hand if you put a lot of pressure on it and once you take the pressure of it will melt and act like a liquid. An example of a non Newtonian fluid is oobleck or quicksand. all fluids have something called viscosity which is how thick or thin the fluid is. viscosity can change depending on how much pressure is on it.
