I wonder how we (school and home) can provide better quality feedback to our students - your children - and continue to add value to their progress?

Swimming: We wish all our swimmers the best of luck as they head to the Regional Swimming Carnival coming up on the 20th March. I am sure we will hear about some great results later in the term.

AGM: Monday 18th March 6.30pm in the staffroom all welcome.

Cricket Report by Sam Black and Aleks Atanasovski

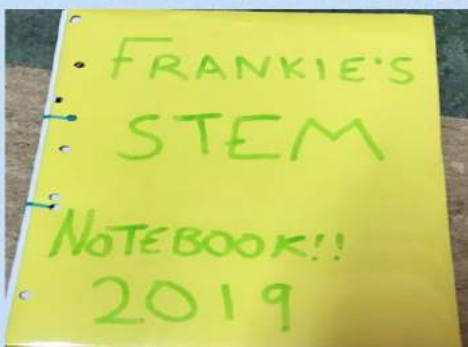

This week we are doing an investigation into the number of teaspoons of sugar in commonly consumed drinks by children and adults. We are going to display our findings in the MPR for everyone to see. Our AIM is to ENCOURAGE EVERYONE to drink MORE water and LESS of these sugary drinks as part of our HEALTHY living strategy. Please feel free to come and have a look at these findings - YOU may be surprised at the amount of EXTRA sugar you are having without even thinking about it.

All families wishing to use OSHC in 2019 are required to fill out a 2019 Registration Form or re-enrol with up to date details and pay a once off Non Refundable \$10:00 Registration Fee per family (not each year of enrolment) and a \$50:00 per child Refundable Bond (not each year of enrolment) that the parent may claim by sending a written request with bank details at the end of using the service to oshc@chilwellps.vic.edu.au Once confirmed all outstanding accounts have been paid the Bond will then be returned to the parents nominated bank account. If you are using this service and have not yet paid your bond per child you will see in the next couple of weeks that these Bonds have been added to your account.

If you are not receiving your correct amount of CCSS rebates you may need to log in to your myGov account and check your child is currently enrolled by confirming your usage. The new system automatically ceases an enrolment if the child has not used this service in any 8 week period and we are required to re-enrol the child/ren and the parent needs to confirm this in their myGov account as I am unable to do this.

As many families will be well aware by now both Tracy and I are off to Bali from Monday the 18/3/2019 returning Tuesday 26/3/2019. OSHC will operate as normal on these days with Rachel Hill, Nilanka Hartwick and Ash Barrett. Please make sure you give them notice if you need to add a booking or cancel a booking during this time.
