Families would have received an email yesterday outlining how to access the students progress in English and Numeracy via the SENTRAL app. The process is simple:

1. Download the SENTRAL app.
2. Go to <https://sentral.chilwell.ps.vic.gov.au/portal/login>
3. Enter your child's name (left hand side).
4. Go to academic reports tab on the right hand side.

Then click on Continuum to access Mathematics and English reports. (i-can statements)

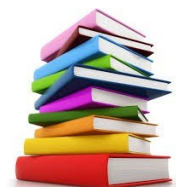

Allergies and Anaphylaxis Reminder

We have a number of children at Chilwell who have **anaphylaxis** which is a severe allergic reaction to foods such as nuts and nut products, sesame, fish, eggs and also to some insect bites. All of these students have action and management plans which include the use of medications and autoinjectors (epipens) if needed. To help keep these students safe and to minimise contact with allergens we have strict no sharing of food requirement at school. We strongly encourage all parents to not send any nut products with their child to school as these life-threatening reactions require the support of our whole community. This is also really important on excursions and special event days where the temptation can be to give your child a special treat. Birthday celebrations are always exciting and some families like to share that with the class. We ask that if you choose to provide a treat that only plain freddo frogs or chuppa chups are provided. These will be provided to the child at the end of the school day to be enjoyed as an after school treat, not during school hours. Students with anaphylaxis will then select an appropriate treat from their treat box where a freddo or chuppa chup can't be given. With parent support we have successfully managed this for many, many years and we look forward to your continued help to keep doing this going forward.
