



## Child Safe Standards overview 2023

- Standard 1** - An organisational structure that is a culturally safe environment in which the diverse and unique identities and experiences of Aboriginal children and young people are respected and valued
- Standard 2** - Child Safety and Wellbeing is embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture
- Standard 3** - Students are empowered about rights, participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously
- Standard 4** - Families and communities are informed and involved in promoting child safety and wellbeing
- Standard 5** - Equity is upheld and diverse needs respected in policy and practice
- Standard 6** - People working with children are suitable and supported to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice
- Standard 7** - Process for complaints and concerns are child focused
- Standard 8** - Staff and volunteers are equipped with the knowledge, skills, and awareness of young people through ongoing education and training
- Standard 9** - Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for young people to be harmed
- Standard 10** - Implementation of Child Safe Standards is regularly reviewed and improved
- Standard 11** - Policies and procedures document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.
